The Houston general election is upon us! Civic participation is a responsibility we all share, so don't forget to go out and vote!


Early voting has started, and will continue through November 3. Election day is November 7. Polling is open from 7AM-7PM at 68 locations across the city—closest to East Montrose is the Metro MultiService Center at 1475 West Grey.

Mayor Turner turns in his keys this year—we thank him for his years of dedication to the city, but that leaves the mayoral seat open. Along with the mayor's race, council member seats, At-Large positions, and the city controller positions will be on the ballot.

Several propositions are on the ballot as well, most notably, allocating funding to rebuild the LBJ hospital campus, amending Article IX of the city charter to allow population proportional voting in the Council of Gov't and Metro Planning Org, and allowing 3+ council members to add items to the city agendas.

Look into the policy platforms of all candidates, and see you at the polls!

Recipe of the Month

Consider combining two classic Thanksgiving favorites in one this year—this is a <u>Pecan-Pumpkin Pie</u> Add it to your table and let us know how much your guests loved it. Recipe by Joanne Chang

Ingredients

Pecan filling

- 1/3 cup granulated sugar
- I/4 cup water, plus more for dipping pastry brush
- I/2 cup light corn syrup
- I tablespoon unsalted butter
- 2 large eggs
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- I/4 teaspoon kosher salt
- I I/4 cups pecan halves (about 5 ounces), toasted
- All-Butter Pie Shell

• Pumpkin Filling

- I cup canned pumpkin
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1/4 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/8 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 2/3 cup heavy cream
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 2 large eggs

Whipped cream

- I cup heavy cream
- 2 tablespoons powdered sugar



Directions

<u>Step one</u> Preheat oven to 350°F. Stir together granulated sugar and 1/4 cup water in a medium saucepan. Using a pastry brush dipped in water, brush off any sugar clinging to sides of pan. Bring mixture to a boil over high, taking care not to jostle pan. Continue boiling, undisturbed, until syrup starts to turn a slightly pale brown, 6 to 8 minutes; gently swirl pan to even out caramelization. Continue boiling over high, swirling pan often, until syrup turns golden brown, about 2 minutes. Reduce heat to medium; carefully pour in corn syrup. (Mixture will sputter a bit and turn clumpy.) Cook, whisking occasionally, until clumps have completely melted, 1 to 2 minutes. Remove from heat; whisk in butter until melted.

<u>Step two</u> Whisk together eggs, vanilla, and salt in a medium-size heatproof bowl. Gradually pour hot sugar mixture into egg mixture, whisking constantly, until completely combined. Add pecans; stir well to coat.

<u>Step three</u> Pour pecan mixture into cooled pie shell. Bake pie in preheated oven until top is starting to set but filling is still jiggly, 15 to 20 minutes. Remove from oven; let cool 5 minutes.

<u>Step four</u> Whisk together pumpkin, vanilla, ginger, cinnamon, salt, and nutmeg in a small saucepan. Cook over high, whisking constantly, until mixture reduces slightly and starts to darken in color, 3 to 4 minutes. Remove from heat; whisk in heavy cream and granulated sugar. Whisk in eggs until well combined.

<u>Step five</u> Pour pumpkin filling over warm pecan filling in pie shell; smooth top. (Cover edges of pie with aluminum foil to prevent overbrowning if crust is getting too dark.) Bake at 350°F until pumpkin filling puffs up and is set, 30 to 40 minutes. Remove from oven; let cool completely on a wire rack, about 2 hours. Gently press plastic wrap onto surface of pie; chill until cold, at least 6 hours or up to overnight.


<u>Step six</u> Beat heavy cream and powdered sugar with an electric mixer fitted with the whisk attachment on medium speed until stiff peaks form, 2 to 3 minutes. Transfer whipped cream to a piping bag fitted with a star tip. Pipe large stars over surface of chilled pie. Serve immediately, or chill, uncovered, up to 6 hours.
