Security update

Help protect our neighborhood! The EMCA is kicking off our 2024-2025 campaign to rehire S.E.A.L. Security through the end of May 2025. The total cost of the campaign is ~\$4,500 per month. We need a minimum of 120 neighbors to participate.

Why do we need private security? Because HPD can't patrol enough or respond fast enough.

Please sign up by selecting a payment option below. Once you have subscribed, please email your contact information (name, address, phone number) to <u>safety.emca@gmail.com</u>. We are migrating to Bigsby, an app to manage our subscriber database. You should have received an email asking you to update your information in Bigsby (if you did not see the article about email updates). If you paid anytime between 1/2023 and 6/2023, your next payment was due on 6/1/2024 for the same (yearly, quarterly or monthly) plan as you previously enrolled. Payments are handled by Stripe credit, debit and ACH gateway.

The patrol cost has decreased a bit as we have reduced patrol hours. We are now offering the following plans and offering EMCA members a discount as EMCA manages the contract and carries the insurance needed for this program:

- Yearly \$450 for EMCA members
- · Quarterly \$112.50 for EMCA members
- Monthly \$37.50 for EMCA members

** Non-members are required to pay an additional \$25 yearly fee to cover administrative costs paid for by EMCA. - Vacation Watch

- Safety escorts when on duty

We believe retaining SEAL provides our neighborhood with protection during critical time periods (as determined by the Safety Committee using Crime Reports). We currently schedule SEAL for ~24 hours weekly with increased coverage during holidays and events. We plan to add more hours as we gain additional subscriptions.

The Security Committee and the EMCA Board (all volunteers) need your help to:

- Distribute flyers
- Canvass the neighborhood for new subscribers
- · Contact previous subscribers via phone, text and emails

We have an additional option which is to donate any amount in multiples of \$50 for our pilot program which consists of installing a Flock Safety camera(s) in our neighborhood to help police fight crime and to keep our neighborhood safe. Cameras work 24/7, they have license plate recognition and will alert police if a wanted vehicle is in our area. The artificial intelligence creates a fingerprint for each vehicle to help identify characteristics on each vehicle and helps law enforcement in any investigation related to our neighborhood. 2024 EAST MONTROSE HOME TOUR and ART WALK

The East Montrose Civic Association will host its 14th Biennial Home Tour and Art Walk on Saturday, October 26, from 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. Situated in the shadow of downtown Houston, East Montrose was platted in the early 1900's - back in the days when Houston's population numbered fewer than 300,000 and a street car ran down what is now Fair-view St.

During the 1960s East Montrose became a center for counterculture and hippie communes. Today a diverse mix of people and architecture, this pedestrian-friendly area was recently named one of the ten great neighborhoods in America.

These homes have original build dates dating back to the early 1900s. Tour goers can get a glimpse of how the architecture has been transformed over the years, with results of unique renovations that are characteristic of this distinctive, eclectic neighborhood.

Also visit the working studios of local artists, all within comfortable strolling distance. You'll be invited in to the space where artists get their inspiration, and you'll see where and how their crafts come to life. Art work ranges from water-color and abstract acrylic paintings, to photography, origami & paper art, books, drawings, sculpture and holiday gifts.

Plus Anderson Fair, the legendary Houston music landmark (since 1969) will be open with refreshments. The interior of this historic building is an art installation in itself. If you are interested in being part of the ArtWalk

EMCA EMAIL DISTRIBUTION LIST

All EMCA Members and Security Patrol Subscribers who have provided an email address should be receiving emails regarding various matters throughout the year. We try to be respectful of people's time and not abuse the distribution. The type of communications we send relates to member meeting updates, event flyers (i.e. National Night Out, Holiday Party, Home Tour, etc.) and registration information.

It has come to our attention that some members who have subscribed to our email newsletter are not receiving the emails. From our research this can be due to restrictions some generic email providers like Yahoo and Gmail (what we use) have in place. These providers put a restriction on how many emails can be sent from a particular email address in a certain amount of time. The service we use to send these emails (Mailchimp) has a specific process in place to ensure emails sent through their application are not restricted. This process involves Mailchimp sending out communications for EMCA with a MailChimpapp.com email "from" address. Unfortunately, this causes some email clients to treat these emails as spam. We are researching alternatives but for now need your assistance.

If you think you should be getting emails from EMCA please do the following:

- 1. Check your SPAM folder and make sure the following email address is marked as "safe" to receive emails from treasurer.emca@51398573.mailchimpapp.com
- 2. Contact treasurer.emca@gmail.com and confirm we have your correct email address on file.

Recipe of the Month

Spiced Apple Zucchini Bread highlights those warm and cozy fall flavors, let us know if you make this at home! Recipe by Monique Volz

Wet ingredients:

• 1 cup shredded zucchini (from 1 medium zucchini)

- 1 cup unsweetened applesauce
- 2 eggs
- ¹/₂ cup pure maple syrup
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- ¹/₄ cup virgin coconut oil, melted and cooled (melted butter will also work)

Dry ingredients:

- 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ cup all purpose flour (or sub gf all purpose flour)
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon allspice
- ½ teaspoon ginger

- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- Mix-ins:
- 1 medium apple, peeled, cored and roughly chopped into ¼ inch pieces (about 1 cup chopped apple)
- 1/3 cup chopped pecans or walnuts, if desired **For the cream cheese glaze:**
- 4 ounces cream cheese, softened
- 2 tablespoons butter, at room temperature
- 3/4 cup powdered sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- ¼ teaspoon cinnamon
- 1-3 teaspoons milk of choice, to thin glaze **To garnish:**
- Extra chopped pecans
- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Line a 8 1/4 x 4 1/2 inch with parchment paper and spray with nonstick cooking spray. Set aside.
- 2. First, measure out I heaping cup of shredded zucchini, then place shredded zucchini in a paper towel, clean dish towel or cheesecloth and squeeze out ALL of the moisture/water. This is very important!
- 3. Add shredded zucchini, applesauce, eggs, maple syrup and vanilla extract to a large bowl and mix well to combine. Next, add in the melted coconut oil and mix again until well combined.
- Add dry ingredients to the wet ingredients: flour, baking soda, cinnamon, allspice, ginger, nutmeg and salt. Mix together with a wooden spoon until well combined. Fold in pecans and chopped apples.
- 5. Pour batter into the prepared pan. Bake for 50-60 minutes or until a tester comes out clean or with just a few crumbs attached. Mine took an hour, but this will vary based on your oven.
- 6. Remove from the oven and place the pan on a wire rack to cool for 15 minutes, then remove bread from the pan and place on a wire rack to finish cooling completely.
- 7. To make cinnamon cream cheese frosting: Beat cream cheese, butter, powdered sugar, vanilla, cinnamon and milk together on medium speed for a minute or until smooth. If you want a warm glaze, you can warm in the microwave in 10-20 second intervals until warm. Pour or spread over cooled bread. Sprinkle chopped pecans. Cut into 10-12 slices and enjoy!
