


Security Update

Happy Lunar New Year! And if you follow the Chinese zodiac, welcome the year of the snake.

As you may have guessed by its name, the Lunar New Year marks the beginning of the lunar or lunisolar calendar. Many cultures and religions around the world celebrate, and you may have seen some festivities in town already. Widely, Jewish, Chinese, Korean and Vietnamese traditions follow the lunisolar calendar, which combines the lunar cycles with the solar year (adding a 13th month every second or third year), while the Islamic and Javanese traditions follow the lunar calendar (12 months, about 10-11 days shorter than the traditional calendar). Right now, you'd be seeing celebrations for the East Asian Lunar New Year.

It is a 2-week long celebration of the arrival of spring, and is marked by a deep home cleaning (to id the home of previous bad lack), brooms then put away, and homes decorated with lanterns, flowers and plants. Doors are adorned with auspicious wishes, the wearing of red (the color of good luck, joy, and prosperity) is highly encouraged, and a reunion dinner is held where families gather to celebrate. Firecrackers, lion dances, and red envelopes are common sights at parties and festivals.

If you get the opportunity, take part in the celebrations! There are festivals taking place all month long.

Montrose Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone ("TIRZ 27") Project Info and Updates

For those who are new to the neighborhood, you may be asking what is a TIRZ and what is TIRZ 27?

Simplistically, a TIRZ, tax increment reinvestment zone, is a tool used by local governments to fund public improvements in a specific area. The City of Houston currently has 24 active TIRZs. All budgets and project plans are approved by City Council. More detailed information can be found at https://comptroller.texas.gov/economy/development/prop-tax/ch311/about-tirz.php.

Why was TIRZ 27 created? In 2015, TIRZ 27 was created by action of the Houston City Council to create and extend capital improvement projects for the purpose of attracting the investment necessary to benefit and revitalize communities with the Zone. At the latest Board Meeting of TIRZ 27 which met on Monday, January 13,2025 the following projects which directly impact East Montrose were discussed. Below are updates as provided by TIRZ 27.

Montrose Boulevard Improvements Projects - Segment I

- I. Designed to address drainage issues while improving mobility, safety, and overall beauty within the Montrose community and was originally presented in 2019.
- Current Status TIRZ 27 has approved final design plans for Segment I (which differ from what I see on the web-site) and have submitted them to the City of Houston. Approval of the final plan is currently pending review by the City of Houston.
- 3. Projected cost for Segment 1 is \$14.7 million.
- 4. Construction timeline will be determined following review and subsequent approval of the final design plans by the City of Houston.

Montrose Safe Routes to School Connections Project

- 1. Aims to enhance safety and accessibility for students and parents as they walk and bike to school.
- Funding for the project was awarded to TIRZ 27 in 2023 through the Houston-Galveston Area Council's (H-GAC) Transportation Policy Council.

Recipe of the Month

Go big or go home this Valentines with a homemade dinner, sure to impress! Make this **Gochujang Carbonara** for a lovely Korean twist on a classic pasta. Recipe by Ambitious Kitchen

Ingredients

- For the pasta:
- 10 ounces thick-cut bacon
- ¾ cup (3 ounces) grated pecorino romano are great!) or parmesan cheese, plus more to garnish
- 2 large eggs, at room temperature
- 2 to 3 tablespoons Gochujang, depending how spicy you like it
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt, plus more to taste
- ½ teaspoon garlic powder
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 12 ounces pasta (I love fettuccine, conchiglie or shellbows for this!)*
- 1 cup reserved pasta water

- For garnish:
- 2 scallions, thinly sliced
- Toasted sesame seeds (black and white are great!)
- Lemon zest, optional for brightness



- Cook the bacon: Add bacon to a large skillet or pan and place over medium heat, cook bacon on both sides until golden brown. If the pan starts to smoke at any point, simply lower the heat. I always cook my bacon on medium to medium low heat. Once bacon is done, transfer to a cutting board and blot with a paper towel to absorb excess grease, then coarsely chop and set aside.
- While the bacon cooks, make the sauce and pasta: In a medium bowl, whisk together the parmesan, eggs, Gochujang, salt, garlic powder and lots of freshly ground black pepper until wellcombined. Set aside.
- Cook the pasta: Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil over high heat. Add pasta and boil until al dente, according to the package directions. Reserve 1 cup of pasta water, then remove from heat and drain. Add pasta back to the pot, immediately add the egg and cheese mixture, and use tongs to quickly and thoroughly coat the pasta with the mixture. The warmth of the pasta will transform the eggs into a creamy sauce; it should not be curdled or chunky. Stream in ½ cup pasta water and toss again to coat the noodles so they are glossy and creamy. Add more pasta water, as necessary, to create a creamier sauce. Taste and season with more salt, as needed.
- Serve: Divide pasta between bowls or plates. Top with bacon pieces and sprinkle each bowl with about 1 tablespoon of grated or shaved parmesan and scallions. If you'd like a little brightness, I suggest adding a little lemon (or lime!) zest on top. Finish it off with a sprinkle of sesame seeds and dig in! Serves 4-6.
