

## **!!PSA: JUGGING INCIDENT!!**

Jugging is a form of theft in which a suspect follows a victim from an ATM or bank to their next location. Recently Jonathan Heng, the son of the owners of Christy's Donuts on West Gray, became a victim of this crime when he was robbed in the parking lot of the donut shop after taking cash out from a bank. Three vehicles blocked exits and a suspect snatched a bag of cash away from him. Fortunately he was unhurt. Per reporting from KHOU, Heng received an outpouring of support and even offers for self-defense classes from neighbors. There have been reports of jugging incidents related to activity at the West Grey BoA prior to this case at Christy's. Houston police are reportedly working on sting operations. HPD recommend keeping an eye on your surroundings and avoiding withdrawing large amounts of cash or visiting banks outside of business hours. If you think you're being followed, drive to the nearest police station. It is important to always be aware of your surroundings and avoid taking unnecessary risks, particularly with bank visits.

Gardening season us upon us! If you didn't start your garden refresh in March, you still have time to get to it. For produce, this is the moment to get your tomatoes, eggplants, peppers, spinach, and cucumbers into the ground. Berries will also do well if you get them in now. Fruit trees do particularly well in Houston, but you do need to stay on them as they struggle if it gets too hot and dry. If you prefer herbs, oregano, basil, cilantro, chives and mint are strong growers if you get them settled before the heat sets in. For florals, this is a great time to plant roses, azaleas, marigolds, begonias, geraniums and petunias—mostly annuals but the roses and azaleas are recurring bloomers which thrive with a bit of attention.

If you got in early and are now maintaining those baby plants, make sure you are pruning carefully—by avoiding early flowering, you can help promote bushier growth.

# **Recipe of the Month**

Thinking of Easter dinner ideas? Or just a really impressive meal for a night in? Look no further because we've got you covered. This is an easy **Roasted Leg of Lamb.** 

**Ingredients** 

I (5- to 7-pound) bone-in leg of

lamb

1/4 cup olive oil, divided

I 1/2 tsp. kosher salt, plus more to taste

I tsp. ground black pepper

3 Tbsp. dijon mustard

8 cloves of garlic

I/4 cup fresh rosemary leaves, roughly chopped

I/4 cup fresh parsley leaves, roughly chopped

2 Tbsp. capers, drained

2 cups chicken broth, divided

I cup white wine

I Tbsp. all-purpose flour

I Tbsp. salted butter



- 1. Pat the lamb dry with paper towels. Using a small, sharp knife, score the fat cap, being careful not to cut into the meat too deeply. Rub all over with 2 tablespoons of oil, salt, and pepper.
- 2. To a blender or small food processor, add the mustard, garlic, rosemary, parsley, capers, and remaining 2 tablespoons of oil. Pulse until a paste is formed. Rub the paste all over the leg of lamb. Let it sit at room temperature for 30 minutes while the oven preheats.
- 3. Meanwhile, preheat the oven to 450°F.
- 4. Place the lamb fat-side up on a wire rack set over a roasting pan. Pour 1 cup of chicken broth into the pan. Roast for 20 minutes. Without opening the oven or removing the roast, reduce the oven temperature to 325°F, and continue roasting the lamb until deeply brown and the internal temperature reads 130°F to 135°F, 1 hour 10 minutes to 1 hour 45 minutes.
- 5. Remove the lamb from the oven, transfer to a sheet pan, and tent with foil for about 30 minutes before serving.
- 6. Meanwhile, remove the wire rack and place the roasting pan on the stove across two burners over medium-high heat. Deglaze the pan with the wine, scraping up any brown bits with a wooden spoon. Cook, stirring frequently, until the wine is reduced by half and no longer has the sharp alcohol smell. Whisk together the remaining 1 cup of chicken broth and flour until smooth. Pour into the pan and bring to a simmer, then cook for 5 minutes, stirring occasionally until smooth and thickened. Stir in the butter until melted and smooth and taste the gravy for salt.
- 7. Thinly slice the lamb and serve it warm with the gravy.
